International Fossil Day 2021

Palaeontological Society of India, Lucknow.

The Palaeontological Society of India (PSI), Lucknow, a Corporate Member of the International Palaeontological Association (IPA) initiated organising the International Fossil Day (IFD) in India since 2016 on October 16. Since 2018, some universities and scientific institutions also joined in organising the IFD in India in October. From 2019, several Student Chapters of the PSI in various universities in India are celebrating IFD by organising lectures, Poster presentations, Quiz programmes, field visits, etc. involving even pre-University students. During 2020 and 2021 IFD was celebrated by organising Online activities, lectures, etc.

In **2021**, the IFD was celebrated (<u>online</u>) by a number of Student Chapters of the PSI in October, 2021 which had very good participation by pre University and University students, research scholars and geoscientists. Prof. M. P Singh, President, Dr. Sudhir Shukla, Vice President & Dr. V. P. Mishra, Secretary of P.S.I. while attending the deliberations briefly introduced about the 'International Fossil Day' to the participants.
